Robert Burns was not the "heaven taught ploughman" some claim, nor was he poor. The Bard was well schooled by John Murdoch, under the instruction of his father William. Burns was an educated man. His Kilmarnock Edition and Edinburgh Edition were best sellers that afforded him some fame, and he had a well-paid job as an exciseman.

This lecture will explore the poverty of the physical environment Burns inhabited, the poverty of the society he lived in and the poverty of his own imagination.
